FOLLOWING LOCATION(S)**

**All businesses along the Highway 17 corridor between Pine  
Street to McLeod Street and Pine Street to Nash Street as well as  
all residents living on East Street**

**DUE TO A RECENT WATER MAIN BREAK, THE SAFETY OF THE DRINKING WATER CANNOT BE GUARANTEED.**

**ALL WATER FROM TAPS SHOULD BE BOILED FOR AT LEAST ONE MINUTE IF IT IS USED FOR HUMAN  
CONSUMPTION**

Boiling removes harmful bacteria in the water that may cause illness. Once boiled, the water can be stored in the refrigerator in a clean food safe container and should be used for other activities where it may be ingested, including:

- Brushing teeth or soaking false teeth
- Washing fruits and vegetables
- Adding to uncooked food or drink
- Ice cubes
- Water for pets
