

Day 1 December 12, 2025 Holiday Lights

- Use outdoor-rated LED lights and hang with nail-free clips to prevent wire damage.
- Check every strand for frayed wires, broken bulbs, or loose connections before use. Discard damaged sets immediately.
- Consider switching to all LED lights to avoid over heating and reduce energy use.
- Only use certified lights and timers (look for CSA, ULC, or ETL marks).
- Never leave lights on overnight or when you're away from home, to avoid overheating.

Holiday safety starts with safe **HOLIDAY LIGHTS.** The glow of the season should come from joy, shared safely with those we love. That's why communities across Ontario are promoting fire-safe decorating practices.

- Inspect every strand of lights for damage and discard any that are frayed or broken.

- Turn lights off overnight or when you're away, to avoid overheating.
- Use outdoor-rated lights for exterior décor.
