We have taken the necessary steps as a Council to correct the wrongs, improve the circumstances and move forward in a progressive and positive manner. We have taken a period of time to reflect and adjust, and now it's time to move forward and renew our friendships, relationships and reflect on the new vision for Ignace of "Building tomorrow by working together today"!

As a Council, we want you to understand this message and hear it often. Our process to bring in professional guidance, communication advice, and leadership on the NWMO project and at a Council level has paid off and we are in good hands as we transition our role into an overall governance mandate that allows our professional staff and team to carry on with their important procedural work both on Township business as well as with the DGR project.

HIRING UPDATES

We are pleased to report that we are in the process of hiring a By-law Officer/ Chief Building Official, and we will be continuing our search for a Project Lead for the NWMO project. We are seeking to expand our strong team with dedicated, experienced, and passionate individuals who will work with Council in Ignace to ensure we stay in a Governance capacity role while they undertake the important day-to-day functions of Township business and the hosting duties under our new NWMO agreement.

NEW ELECTRONIC SIGN

Over the past few months, we launched a new Electronic Sign on the arena to provide valuable information and updates to the public, and continue to welcome visitors to the area. A new policy was developed to ensure that both the Township and our local charitable and community groups all have an opportunity to provide the important public messages that we need to communicate.

2025 BUDGET

After careful deliberation and research presented by the CAO and Clerk Treasurer, Council approved the 2025 Budget at the July 7, 2025 meeting. Council approved a modest 3% increase to property tax levies to support ongoing initiatives, as well as a 10% increase to wastewater (sewer) usage rates.

SPRING & SUMMER 2025 INITIATIVES

Small Modular Reactor Canada Summit

The Township of Ignace participated in an important panel on community engagement and presented to over 500 municipal delegates from across Canada at the summit on March 4-5, 2025, in Sherwood Park, Alberta.

Implementation Committee Structure and Advancement

The Township has appointed the CAO and Deputy Mayor as the two Ignace representatives on the newly established Implementation Committee, alongside two NWMO Executive representatives. This committee will continue to guide the process and adhere to the Municipal Hosting Agreement between both parties.

Community Engagement Committee (CEC)

The first few meetings of the the newly established CEC took place in Ignace. Councillors Jodie Defeo and Janet Lett were appointed to the committee, and Councillor Defeo and Chantal Moore were named Co-chairs. The committee continues to seek youth representation as well as two members at large, and welcomes all applicants. A recruitment campaign continues into August. The committee will be planning Town Hall Updates for fall 2025, an NWMO and Township Community Celebration event to be held in September, and other lunch information meetings with community groups.

Ontario Good Roads Conference

The Township of Ignace was represented at the annual Good Roads conference in Toronto on March 30 - April 2, 2025 by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and CAO. NWMO sponsored some very important sessions, and Mayor Baigrie had an opportunity to update the audience on the Deep Geological Repository (DGR) project and to introduce the NWMO keynote speaker at the conference.

Nuclear Safety Commission of Canada

Mayor Kim Baigrie, Deputy Mayor Wayne Minnear and staff members met with the Nuclear Safety Commission of Canada to begin the communication and advancement of the regulatory and licensing process around the DGR project.

Canadian Nuclear Association Annual Conference

The Annual Canadian Nuclear Association National Conference was held in Ottawa on April 15 - 17, 2025, and the Township of Ignace was once again represented by the Mayor, CAO, Deputy Mayor and Project Lead at this critical networking session with world leaders in the nuclear industry, including municipal partners and communities in Canada.

MORE SPRING & SUMMER 2025 INITIATIVES

Community Open House - Deep Geological Repository (DGR) Project

A variety of agencies including the Township of Ignace held a Public Open House on May 13, 2025, at the Recreational Centre in Ignace. The event was attended by the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO), the Nuclear Safety Commission of Canada, Impact Assessment Canada, the Township of Ignace and other stakeholders. This unique opportunity gave concerned citizens more information on upcoming events and activities related to the long-term DGR project and the NWMO Centre of Expertise to be built in Ignace in the near future.

Indigenous Corporate Training

On May 21 - 22, 2025, Township of Ignace Council, staff and committee members participated in two half-day sessions to receive Indigenous Corporate Training to advance networking and reconciliation understanding with members of First Nations communities in Northwestern Ontario. We are committed to recognizing and acknowledging the history of the land we share, and especially to establishing lasting partnerships with our neighbours from Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and the Ojibway Nation of New Saugeen.

International Atomic Energy Association (IAEA) Presentations

Mayor Kim Baigrie and Councillor Jodie Defeo represented the Township of Ignace at an important IAEA conference in Vienna, Austria, on May 27 - 31, 2025. Alongside representatives from Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and NWMO, the Township of Ignace participated at the special request of the Director General of the IAEA. The Ignace group was praised for the hard work, determination, courage and leadership it took to become Canada's first ever DGR site.

Ontario Association of Police Services Boards (OAPSB) Conference

Mayor Kim Baigrie represented the newly renamed Ignace/Ojibway Nation of New Saugeen O.P.P. Detachment Board (formerly known as the Ignace Police Services Board or Dryden O.P.P. Detachment Board 2) at the OAPSB conference in London, Ontario on June 3 - 5, 2025.

AMCTO Conference

Aaron Gullins, the CAO for the Township of Ignace, and Lesley Sterling, the new Clerk Treasurer, attended the annual Association of Municipal Managers, Clerks and Treasurers of Ontario (AMCTO) Conference on June 8 - 11, 2025 in Windsor.

QUARTERLY UPDATE

The Township of Ignace and NWMO (Nuclear Waste Management Organization)

The Township of Ignace remains committed and excited on the advancement of the construction of a deep geological repository in the Ignace/Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation area. Over the course of the last few months, the Township of Ignace has been featured throughout Canada and internationally on this project. The project has placed Ignace on the world map, and we expect to host international visitors in the coming years as the project advances.

The NWMO has initiated and made considerable progress towards a "structure-wide" restructuring project which has led to a variety of positive and progressive improvements in the organization. Those changes will continue to be communicated throughout the next few months. Most notably, the Northwestern Ontario Advancement and Siting Team is now being led by Ms. Jessica Perritt, who will oversee much of the work surrounding NWMO progress on the project, working with both the community of Ignace, the Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and other stakeholders in Northwestern Ontario.

Jessica comes into this role with 17 years experience at the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) in Indigenous engagement and relations. Throughout her time, she built meaningful relationships with both municipalities and Indigenous communities that have been involved in the siting process. She has been a primary contributor to the NWMO's Indigenous Knowledge and Reconciliation Journey and will bring that experience and perspective into her new role as Director of Indigenous and Municipal Relations.

FIRE SAFETY OPEN AIR BURNING OF BRUSH, WOOD OR CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL PILES IS PROHIBITED

**NO PERMITS WILL BE ISSUED FOR THIS TYPE OF BURNING
FROM APRIL 1, 2025 TO OCTOBER 31, 2025**

Permits are being allowed for small cooking and heating fires. Permits are required for ALL burning.

If there is a Restricted Fire Zone put into place because of High Fire Hazard, NO fires will be allowed.

The following are the governing bodies for all burning and issuance of fire permits:
