KDSB to offer services at a new location in Dryden

Families, individuals, and seniors in the Dryden region will be accessing Kenora District Services Board's (KDSB) services at a new office space soon. The KDSB will be moving into their new office location at 20 King Street in downtown Dryden and ready to serve the community at 1:00 pm on Monday, June 7, 2021.

20 King Street and 211 Princess Street will be closed to the public for in-person and phone/email services from 9:00 am – 1:00 pm on Monday, June 7, to allow staff time to move. During the COVID-19 Pandemic, modified office hours are still in effect. The new Dryden office location will continue to operate from 9:00 am – 3:30 pm, Monday through Friday.

"We are pleased to offer services to the community right in the heart of downtown Dryden. We want to thank Dave McKay Construction and Nelson Architecture Inc. for designing and creating this beautiful, welcoming, and open space for those in the community accessing our services," says Henry Wall, Chief Administrative Officer of the KDSB.
