We invite those who may be frustrated by the process to explore those rules within the context of the Municipal Act. That training will be provided and brought forward to the two new Councillors once they are chosen and sworn into Council.

Regardless of the process, the most important and hopefully most resounding message that I wanted to bring across to the residents of Ignace is that we must work closely together today, to build a stronger and more vibrant community for tomorrow. We need to ensure that we are respecting each other as colleagues, friends and concerned citizens of this community that we call home. We must also be cognizant of the fact that we want this community to be stronger, and be seen as inviting, invigorating and inclusive of new citizens and those we want to attract to this gorgeous part of the world. Let us all put aside our differences to build that stronger tomorrow.
