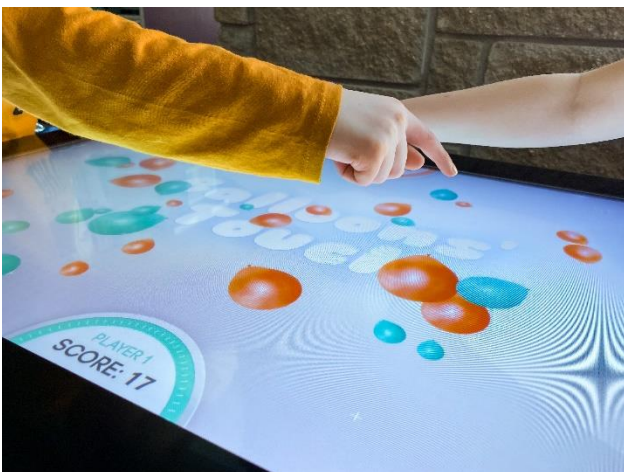
PLAY TOUCH VIRTUAL TABLE ARRIVES AT IGNACE PUBLIC LIBRARY



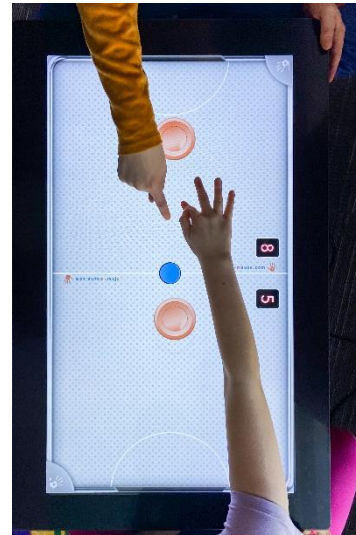
An extremely popular addition to the library, attracting attention from all ages!

This new 32" interactive Play Touch Table allows users to engage in educational multi-touch games from ages 3 to adult. There are many games to choose from and the screen has a special anti-glare, anti-viral surface for easy care and maintenance.
