The Ignace Community Mural event was held on Saturday, July 16th in the Recreation Centre parking lot. Members of the community came out to help paint parts of the mural, and Township staff and students completed the mural this week. A frame will be constructed and installation of the mural on the outside of the Recreation Centre will occur once the frame is complete and the weather seal is set.

This initiative is part of the Ignace Urban Art & Senior's Trail, and this project was designed by the Township of Ignace's Community Designer, Kimberly Richards, to involve the community in the creative process and create a sense of pride and ownership of the project for community members.

The Ignace Urban Art & Senior's Trail began in the summer of 2021 with the repaving of the Agimak Creek Trail and the painting of bike lane lines. The Community Mural will be the second art installation on the Urban Art Trail in 2022. On June 18th the Ignace Skate Park Art Project event had 12 Ignace youth participate in beautifying the area with a colourful geometric design. Local artists Robert Furlong and Kimberly Richards will each be completing permanent art urban art installations this year as well. To improve the accessibility of the Ignace Urban art & Senior's Trail, seating, bike racks, solar lighting, additional waste receptacles, and dog waste systems will also be coming soon to the streets of Ignace.

## **Ignace Seniors Housing Complex**

It pleases the Township of Ignace to announce the property that will house the new senior housing complex has been cleared of trees and debris.

The Ignace Seniors Housing Steering Committee met on June 24, 2022, and chose the successful contractor, Finn Way General Contractors, designed by Nelson Architecture Inc., to build the 20-unit Seniors Housing Complex. The Council for the Corporation of the Township of Ignace approved the recommendation at the Regular Meeting of Council on July 18, 2022.

"The senior housing complex has been needed in the community for some time. This project has been made possible through the combined efforts of the Township of Ignace, Mary Berglund Community Health Centre, Kenora District Services Board, Nuclear Waste Management Organization, and the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC)," says Mayor Lucas.

The complex will include four two-bedroom and 16 one-bedroom units with kitchens, bathrooms and patio space. There are also common areas for gatherings and office space for on-site support.

Heidi West, the Executive Director of the Mary Berglund Community Health Centre and Chairperson of the senior housing steering committee, says that "this is an important project that will allow our aging population to live in their community and have family support along with having the camaraderie of friends close by. The building of this complex is an exciting time for our community."

The Grade 7 & 8 class were asked to brainstorm what should be included in a clear map as well as what a good community needs to have for services.


Ignace's Final Zoning By-Law maps were shown and discussed about what different zones mean and why they are important.

## **Tell Me a Story**

"I was born in England during World War II, in Caterham, in the southern area. My dad was a Canadian soldier, and my mom an English war bride. I remember having to sleep under a bed with my mom because of the bombing, and seeing the glass from the broken windows on the floor in the morning.

After the war was over we couldn't come to Canada right away because my grandmother was old and sick and the authorities would not let her come to Canada (not like it is today!). My mom had to stay in England and look after her until she died.

In November, 1950, we finally sailed for Canada on the *Empress of Canada*. The crossing was during one of the worst storms experienced in a long while. My mom was seasick the whole time and had to stay in our cabin, but I was not sick and roamed the ship by myself.

I guess the captain felt sorry for me, and had me take my meals at his table. I remember there was a large bowl of fresh fruit – grapes, bananas, oranges, apples – that I had never before had the chance to see or taste for real. One funny thing happened, and the joke was on me – there was a small bowl of water with a lemon slice in it. I was thirsty during the meal and I drank the water, not knowing that it was a finger bowl! It tasted good to me! When we got to Canada my dad met us at Montreal. I was almost 9 years old, and it's the first time I remember seeing him. We took the train to New Brunswick, and had breakfast on the train. I was shocked at the amount of food available, because rationing was still in effect in England. I exclaimed to my dad, "You're eating a whole rasher of bacon!" Canada was sure different from post-war England!"

## Emmanuel Anglican/United Church Programs Blessings in a Backpack

Blessings in a backpack is one initiative of Emmanuel Anglican/United Church. This program has been operating for 7 years in Ignace and it provides food for the weekend for children in need who are in Jr. Kindergarten to Grade 8. The school has identified them as potential recipients and parental/guardian consent is required. They may or may not utilize the service. It is available to both Ignace School and Ecole Immaculee Conception. The heavy bags are delivered to the home every Friday afternoon. The bags may include some of the following: fresh fruituirt, bread, milk, eggs, granola bars, peanut butter, cheese whiz, fresh vegetables, soup, kraft dinner, cans of meat, beans ravioli, pancake mix etc. The plan is to provide something for each meal on the weekends for the students. Filling hungry tummies is important as hunger doesn't take weekends off! The monthly menu varies; weeks 2 and 4 include milk, weeks 3 and 5 are eggs and week 1 is peanut butter (so far no allergies). This international program is to operate September to June. When covid hit, we began including the summer months and it has now turned into a full year program for us here! We are always very appreciative of donations to this essential program.

## Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) encourages residents to review new community studies

We have reached another important milestone in the site selection process to build Canada's deep geological repository to safely contain and isolate used nuclear fuel. Beginning this month and throughout the year, a variety of community studies related to the Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation-Ignace siting area are being released.

The studies work to address many of the fundamental questions community members have asked about the project and speak to several important environmental and socio-economic impacts. They provide an opportunity for the community to understand and help shape how the project could be implemented if it proceeds in this area.

Transparent community dialogue and collaboration has been at the heart of the NWMO's work within the Wabigoon Lake Ojibway Nation and the Township of Ignace. The feedback from both communities has been and will continue to be vital in advancing Canada's plan for the safe long-term management of used nuclear fuel. The release of these studies is the outcome of working together with Ignace and the region to identify and answer some of the fundamental and important questions related to the project.

Ultimately, these studies are a reminder that your voice matters.

It's an exciting time to start seeing tangible results about what it would mean to implement this national environmental infrastructure project in Ignace. Some of the possibilities include:

- hundreds of reliable long-term jobs created over several generations;
- opportunities for local businesses;
- a growing and stable population to support more community services;
- a Centre of Expertise that will be home to world-class research; and
- improved infrastructure

The project would also serve as a catalyst in the community, attracting other businesses and services to the Ignace area.

Canada's plan will only proceed in an area with hosts that are both informed and willing. We know the studies will provide a great deal of information to take in, and we encourage residents to take time to review them. This public information is an essential tool to help communities make an informed decision about the project.

Print versions will be available at the Ignace Learn More Centre and digital versions will also be made available on the NWMO's website. Please tune into Ignace Community Nuclear Liaison Committee (ICNLC) meetings to learn more and watch for opportunities for in person events this summer.

## **Update on the Team at MBCHC**

## Your Centre for Health and Wellbeing

There has been a lot of news lately about Emergency Room and Primary Care closures because of the Physician and health human resource challenges we have been experiencing across our region and Ontario as a whole. The MBCHC is also starting to experience Physician shortages. It is with much sadness that we are saying good bye to another one of our long-time regular locum docs. Dr. Merali has made the decision to begin his retirement starting in August. He will be missed by the team here at the health centre and the many clients he sees regularly in the community.

People should be able to access care when they need it, in their communities – but this is sadly not always the case. Our situation across the region is dire and we are all working very hard to recruit Physicians to Northwestern Ontario. There are significant differences with funding and payment models across the various sectors, however this is not the only challenge. Funding always helps but it is not the only answer to this problem- there is a lack of Physicians and health human resources in general.

"You can have all the funding in the world, but without the people to hire – what do you do?" The physician and health human resources challenges throughout our region are proving detrimental to patients and the current staffing we do have. Patients are and will continue to experience longer wait times for even simple appointments. Physicians are not adequately able to treat patients due to patient overload. Ultimately, the continued shortages will negatively and dramatically impact overall quality of healthcare here in Ignace and across the region.

A Physician shortage not only affects hospital patients, but those who regularly visit their primary care provider. Patient satisfaction is dropping and there is an increased risk for negative health consequences.

The health human resource challenges have many effects, including:

- Greater pressures to meet client/patient needs
- Time constraints on doctor patient interactions
- Increased workloads
- Over worked and stressed health teams
- Long wait times for appointments
- When ER's close, patients in need of urgent care will now have to travel up to three hours to access emergency care. "That is not fair to people in this community or any other for that matter. But what do you do- if the hospitals do not have the staffing to safely provide care. This is something beyond their control."

## What Can and Are We Doing?

- We are doing everything possible to recruit new Physicians
- We need to focus on preventative care to keep people from needing to go to Emergency and out of
  hospitals, but in order to do this we need more primary care Physicians available to see patients and
  increase access to care here in the community.
- We look at alternative ways to deliver care; through phone and virtual when a Physician cannot physically be on site
- Delivery of care cannot be provided exclusively through individual domains of practice, but through multidisciplinary teams. Providing care in this way can and does ease some of the Physician workload
- Many northern towns rely on nurses with expanded skill sets to provide care. When required, our nurses call doctors in larger communities for advice.
